Main Features of the EUROCORES Scheme:

- Investigator driven, all areas of science
- Creates critical mass for research excellence in a specific topic in Europe
- Provides flexible framework for collaboration of national basic research funding agencies
- Involves typically 9-23 participating countries
- Open and transparent process
- European competition with international Peer Review
- Funding remains national but is "networked" by ESF
- Networking and scientific management funded from 20
 M€ EC contract

Key Information on running EUROCORES Programmes



Participating EFA's	9-30
Size (research funding)	5-12 M€
 Projects (Outline) submitted 	50-300
Projects funded	14-21
From idea to call	15-20 months
Opening of Call (Outline)	3 months
Review and ranking	9-12 months
Commitments by EFAs	5+ months
Start projects	1-25 months



Developing EUROCORES: a more systematic approach



- EUROCORES Committee under the EB for the quality control
- Once a year competition for EUROCORES ideas
- Agreed process for arriving at financial commitments
- High standard peer review with independent top level panels
- Strong science management of the EUROCORES, once running

FP 7 and ESF: ERA-Net Plus



- Prior commitment of funds to specified themes
- Themes proposed by EUROHORCS and ESF building on inputs from the scientific community
- ESF as handling agent for Calls, single peer review and management
- Funding of best proposals without juste retour
- EC tops up with 20-30% research money plus coordination and networking
- Involvement of scientists from non participating countries



Outcomes



Ideally

 Agreed process for all phases of an improved EUROCORES scheme

Minimum

- Building blocks for such a process
- Agreement on issues to be resolved



Follow up



- Small working group to assist ESF in drafting a proposal for an improved EUROCORES Scheme and in developing proposals for resolving outstanding issues
- Draft proposal circulated to participants and MO's in January
- Second (open?) workshop in February?
- Procedure ready by 1st April
- Governing Council April 2005
