





Structure of the meeting

- International Workshop on Peer Review 6-7 Dec. 2011 to discuss key issues and challenges in Peer Review common to research funding organisations:
 - Peer Review of Pluridisciplinary Research
 - Use of Bibliometrics in Peer Review
 - Quality assurance in Peer Review
 - Defining and Measuring Broader Impact
- Global Summit on Merit Review May 2012



Timeline principles

- Dec. 2011, Peer Review Forum agree on the European Draft Statement on Peer Review Principles
- European representatives attend ISC meeting in Paris on December 12 to:
 - Draft a Statement of Principles on Merit Review
 - Develop an Agenda for the May 2012 meeting
 - Communicate the Statement of Principles with regional funding agencies prior to the May 2012 meeting.
- January 2012, distribute draft statement of principles for comments within the Forum's members
- February 2012, deadline for feedback on draft statement of principles
- March 2012, finalize statement of principle on Merit Review
- Debriefing to European HORCs, date to be determined.
- May 14-15 Global Summit of HORCs in Washington DC
