### 1) Purpose of the visit

I was invited by Professor Majumder to present at the Forum for Information Retrieval Evaluation (FIRE) 2014 conference held in Bangalore, India, 05/12/2014-09/12/2014.

## 2) Description of the work carried out during the visit

I attended FIRE 2014 as an invited speaker and gave a talk entitled "Examining the limits of crowdsourcing for relevance assessment". I also met with a number of PhD students to discuss their thesis topics and offer advice/guidance, as well as discuss the organisation of a future potential FIRE task with Debasis Ganguly from Dublin City University (DCU) on story illustration. I also discussed possible future research collaborations with Professor Majumder.

### 3) Description of the main results obtained

I am writing a research paper entitled "Evaluation: thinking outside the (search) box" for inclusion in the FIRE 2014 proceedings. I am co-organising a FIRE 2015 track on story illustration with Debasis Ganguly from DCU.

4) Future collaboration with host institution (if applicable)

I am intending to continue discussions with Professor Majumder about future research collaborations and we are actively seeking UK-Indian funding opportunities.

I am writing a research paper entitled "Evaluation: thinking outside the (search) box" for inclusion in the FIRE 2014 proceedings. This provides a summary of work carried out on a recent EU-funded project to develop an information system consisting of multiple finding aids. The paper describes evaluation methods used and highlights the need for more focus in IR on evaluation beyond the seach box.
