Commission funds ties between Graphene and Human Brain

A group led by the European Science Foundation has received €1 million from Horizon 2020 to promote links between the EU's two billion-euro Flagship initiatives.

The SCOPE project is intended to promote a “partnering environment” between the Graphene Flagship and the Human Brain Project, according to the European Commission.

The flagship initiatives pledged as much as €500 million from Horizon 2020 to both initiatives—but the management structures, in particular of the Human Brain Project, have come under fire.

The project is headed up by the ESF, the Ecole Polytechnique Federale de Lausanne (which leads the Human Brain project) and the Spanish foundation for science (Fecyt).

“The building of flexible, integrated and collaborative research structures is fundamental to both our work as an organisation and the FET Flagship projects themselves,” said the ESF chief executive Jean-Claude Worms.
